

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The "How to Use the Platform" manual is designed to support users in navigating the Green Youth Employability e-learning space.

It offers clear, step-by-step guidance on how to register, access and complete courses, participate in forum discussions, use interactive features like quizzes, and reflect through the eportfolio tool.

The manual aims to make the platform accessible, practical, and empowering for young learners exploring sustainability and green skills.



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The "How to Use the Platform" manual is developed within the framework of the Erasmus+ KA2 project Green Youth Employability: Emerging Skills and Jobs for a Fair and Green Society (2023-1-IT03-KA220-YOU-000157988).

The project aims to support **young people** in navigating the **green transition** by providing **educational tools**, **guidance** and **accessible learning resources**.

Through **non-formal** and **blended education**, the **GYE platform** offers an **interactive space** to explore **green competences** and acquire **key skills** for **emerging job markets**.

The platform and its contents are the result of the collaboration between **four European organisations**: Scambieuropei ETS (Italy), project coordinator; VŠ Grm Novo mesto (Slovenia); TOPCOACH (Slovakia); and Alzira On Europe (Spain).

This manual is designed to help users get started with **the e-learning space**, access **courses** and take full advantage of interactive features such as **quizzes**, **forums** and the **e-portfolio area**. All resources are **available for free** and aim to foster **lifelong learning**, **sustainability** and **employability** among young people.

Courses and tools on the platform offer **practical and accessible content** for learners and educators across Europe. The consortium identified and developed four specific learning courses, chosen on the basis of a **sound needs analysis** carried out before and during the project. This analysis took into account local contexts as well as research conducted with young people, youth workers, and relevant stakeholders.





Learners can use this **platform** as a flexible and accessible tool to engage in **non-formal education** and develop key competences for a **sustainable future**.

The platform supports **orientation towards emerging green jobs** and fosters employability in the sustainability sector. It offers interactive learning experiences that encourage critical thinking, promote responsible actions, and inspire sustainable lifestyles.

Available in **multiple languages**, this e-learning space supports **inclusive learning**, helping users of all backgrounds explore new opportunities and prepare for the **green job market**. By learning here, you are joining a generation of **active changemakers** building a fairer and more sustainable world.

Background

The GYE project was designed to tackle three major issues affecting our societies, daily lives, and future prospects.

On one hand, climate change is one of the most urgent challenges impacting us daily. Despite various EU policies addressing this issue, fostering a cultural and mindset change is crucial. Promoting a just transition in the economic sector is equally important.

On the other hand, youth employment has faced longstanding difficulties, not due to a lack of skills or education, but because of structural issues. Addressing these challenges is vital for the future workforce. Connecting climate change and youth employment, there is a pressing need for environmental transformation. The EU Green Deal and the UN Sustainable Development Goal 13 emphasize the importance of the green transition. Emerging and future green jobs can support a fair environmental and employment transition, offering new opportunities.





The GYE platform and its educational resources have been developed to respond to the growing demand for green skills and accessible, high-quality content for learners. It provides practical tools and structured content that can be used to create a wider ripple effect—supporting young people, youth workers, educators, and organisations in building meaningful learning pathways focused on sustainability.

The platform is built around non-formal education (NFE) and experiential learning, offering users an engaging way to explore green skills and careers that are increasingly important not only for future employment, but also for becoming responsible, conscious citizens.

Whether you are learning on your own or guiding others, the platform offers an ambitious and ready-to-use set of tools to support your educational or professional journey.

Aims and Methodology

The Green Youth Employability (GYE) platform was created to offer accessible, high-quality content for anyone interested in exploring the world of green jobs and sustainable development. It supports young people, educators, and professionals by providing practical tools, interactive courses and best practices based on Non-Formal Education (NFE) and blended learning.

Through its activities, GYE aims to engage youth workers, educators, employment staff, and young people in a learning process that builds both **green awareness** and **concrete skills**.





The platform encourages users to become **agents of change**, actively contributing to a fair and sustainable future.

The development of the platform's learning content was grounded in a participatory and evidence-based approach. The consortium identified and developed four specific learning courses, selected through a sound needs analysis conducted during the project. This analysis was informed by the diversity of local contexts and supported by targeted research involving young people, youth workers, and relevant stakeholders. This ensured that the learning offer responds to real needs and current trends in sustainability education and green employability.

During the development process, GYE partners designed and tested learning materials with young people and local stakeholders (youth workers, educators, local institution members, actors from the sustainability or labor market sectors) across Europe. Their **feedback** helped shape the final content available on the platform.

As a result, each learning module reflects **real needs**, encourages **active participation**, and supports **lifelong learning** in sustainability-related fields.

The platform's **methodology** recognises the importance of adapting learning to the background and needs of each user. By doing so, it ensures that every learner can gain **meaningful competences** and explore potential applications in their personal, educational, or professional journey.





Limitations

The GYE e-learning platform offers a set of resources and courses designed to support the development of green skills through non-formal education (NFE). While it is a powerful and ambitious tool, there are some important aspects to keep in mind:

- **Target Audience**: The learning content and activities were primarily tested with young people aged 18–30, from diverse backgrounds. If you plan to use the platform with younger learners or groups with specific needs, you are encouraged to adapt the sessions to ensure they are appropriate, accessible and engaging.
- Program Structure and Adaptability: The platform is not intended to serve as a complete or standalone training program. Instead, it offers inspirational content and flexible tools designed to guide and motivate young people in exploring green job opportunities. To ensure a meaningful learning experience, young people should be supported by youth workers in designing a structured pathway tailored to their needs, with clearly defined learning objectives and outcomes. The platform's resources can be used as building blocks broader educational or career guidance programs. Practitioners may choose to combine sessions from different courses or focus deeply on a single topic. However, combining modules across themes without a clear structure may result in a fragmented or overly broad learning experience. It is essential to always consider the specific needs of your learners and the local context when planning and delivering content.
- **Customisation**: The learning path is not one-size-fits-all and should be carefully customised to meet the specific needs of each learner. To support this process, the platform provides tools such as the e-portfolio and quizzes, which can help learners reflect on their journey, track progress, and make informed decisions about their next steps.





What the reader can find in the Manual

The "How to Use the Platform" manual offers a comprehensive and user-friendly guide to navigating the GYE e-learning platform. It is designed to support young people, youth workers, educators and all users involved in the Green Youth Employability project by providing clear and practical instructions to access and make full use of the platform's features.

Rooted in the GYE project's objectives of fostering digital inclusion and blended learning, this manual serves as a practical resource to accompany users through their digital learning experience. It explains how to access courses, follow the learning path, complete quizzes, engage in discussions through the forum and reflect on personal and professional development using the e-portfolio space.

The structure of the manual reflects the logic and flow of the **user experience** on the platform. It begins with an **introduction** to the GYE e-learning space, highlighting its role within the wider context of the project. The central part of the manual consists of a detailed, **step-by-step walkthrough** of each platform function, supported by images to ensure clarity.

Finally, a closing section provides practical guidance on where to find help in case of technical or content-related questions, including the **contact form** available directly through the platform.

This manual is meant to empower users to actively and independently engage with the platform, reinforcing the values of **accessibility**, **participation** and **self-directed learning** promoted by the GYE project.









2.1 Context and Background

Youth Unemployment



For a long time, young people have faced high unemployment rates, not due to their lack of skills or education, but because of structural issues. GYE project provides not only a tool for youth workers to operate successful green soft skills training on NFE, but also an elearning platform to have an orientation on possible jobs and 4 hubs in 4 different countries to experience green learning and to come into contact with the communities networking.

Environmental Transformation



Connecting the first two points, there is a pressing need for environmental transformation. The EU Green Deal and the UN Sustainable Development Goal 13 highlight the importance of the green transition. Young people are increasingly interested in taking action, seeing the crisis as both a social and learning challenge. As noted by the ILO (2022), the crisis may have accelerated structural changes in the labour market, presenting opportunities in growing sectors for young people at the start of their careers. Emerging and future green jobs can support a fair environmental and employment transition, offering new opportunities. With the right policy mix, future job markets and green developments can be analysed to provide young people with the necessary skills and re-skilling procedures (The Future of Jobs is Green, 2021).

Young people should be empowered to think critically, act responsibly, and live sustainably in response to the climate crisis, ensuring their engagement, active participation and a just transition in the process.

The GYE project's activities and results collect and address the needs of green actors while proposing practical activities for youth workers to create a ripple effect.

2.2 Objectives

GYE's goal is to create structured learning and guidance for young people in emerging Green Jobs through Non-Formal Education (NFE) and blended learning.





GYE believes in the urgency to act for the creation of a sustainable EU that offers care and quality employment for young people.

It provides innovative methods, best practices, and tools for young people, educators, and labour centre members to ensure a quality learning experience and a fair transition to green development.

- Empower and support young people in their personal and professional green development by providing them with learning activities for personal and social green change and a digital learning MOOC;
- Give value to Non-Formal Education methodology in the green soft skills learning, acquisition and reflection for young people;
- Train and share best practices among 12 youth workers in blended learning programs to support young people orienteering and skills development;
- Foster synergies among the youth, labor, and institutional sectors at local and EU
 levels and raise awareness on the need to collaborate for a mixed policy in green
 and youth society fostering green communities and fair transition.

2.3 Activities

The project is structured into 5 Work Packages with each a series of activities designed to achieve its objectives:

- Development of the MOOC based on WP2 Transnational Meeting

- Learning Activities: Engage young people in testing and learning about green skills.

WP4 THE GREEN YOUTH LAB

- Training for Trainers: Equip trainers with the skills to support young people with green competences development
- Green Youth Labs: Conduct four labs to provide hands-on experience.

WP5 PROMOTION, DISSEMINATION. MULTIPLYING EVENTS AND SUSTAINABILITY

- Promotion events engaging local stakeholders
- Dissemination Events: Share project outcomes and best practices
- Social Media Campaigns
- Final Multiplying event each in its local community

2.4 Expected Results

The GYE project aims to produce several key outputs:

- **Survey Report:** Insights into the current state of youth employability in green jobs.
- **Toolkit for Youth Workers**: Tools and methods for supporting green skills acquisition, available in English and four other languages.
- MOOC: An online course with at least four learning modules, a forum for peer interaction, an e-portfolio space for reflection and employability, and a manual for the e-learning platform.
- Green Youth Labs: Practical labs to apply green skills and networking in local communities.
- **Handbook**: Documentation of experiences and best practices from the Green Youth Labs.





The project significantly enhances the youth sector by providing high-quality resources for youth development in green jobs.

Youth workers gain access to powerful methods and tools through a Toolkit for Green Soft Skills, Mooc and digital learning know-how, a pilot learning program based on blended learning addressing both local and EU needs. Exchange of best practices and innovation are put into place.

This initiative not only boosts young people's employability in the green sector but also promotes sustainable practices, cultural change, active and aware citizenship, fostering a more environmentally conscious and skilled workforce.



This is **the starting page** of the platform, where you can return at any time to get an **overview** or **navigate to other areas**.






ACCOUNT

Creating an account is mandatory (and free!) in order to access and participate in all sections of the platform, including the courses, quizzes, forum and e-portfolio.

From here you can view your progress and manage your learning activity.

3.2 How to Register

To **access** the GYE learning platform and **begin exploring** its free courses and interactive tools, users must first **create** a **personal account**. Registration is free, quick, and necessary to track your progress, access all content, and use features like the forum and e-portfolio.

Follow these **steps to register**:

- 1.Go to the GYE platform website: greenyouthemployability.eu
- 2.On the top-right corner of the homepage, select "Account".
- 3. Fill in the required information, including **your email address** and a **secure password**.
- 4. Confirm your password and click on the **Register button**.

Once you have registered, you may be asked to verify your email address. After verification, you can log in at any time with your credentials.


Note: Make sure to remember the email and password you used during registration, as these will be required each time you log in.








3.2 How to Register



After logging in, you will have full access to the platform's features:

You can now proceed to browse the available courses and begin your learning journey.






3.3 How to Access a Course

Once you are registered and logged into the GYE learning platform, you can easily browse and access the available courses.

Follow the steps below to access a course:

1. Click on "Courses" in the top navigation menu



2. You will be redirected to **the course list page**, where you can see all available courses: *Circular Economy, Digital Transformation, Sustainable Cuisine* and *Green Soft Skills*. Each course is presented with a title, a **short description** and a **visual preview**.









3.3 How to Access a Course

3. **Select the course you are interested** in by clicking on its title or image preview. This will take you to **the course overview page**, where you can read more about the course content and structure.











After enrolling in a course, you will be guided through a structured sequence of learning content. Each **course is divided** into **modules**, which are designed to help you gradually explore the topic through different formats such as **video lectures**, **reading materials**, **reflection prompts** and **assessment activities**.

When you enter a course, you will land on the **course structure page**, where all modules are listed in **chronological order**.










To begin, click on the first available module. Each lesson typically includes a pre-recorded video lecture, which forms the core of the learning content.

Below the video, you will find several interactive and support tools, designed to enhance the learning experience:

- Settings You can adjust playback speed, accessibility or subtitles (available in 5 languages: English, Italian, Slovak, Slovenian and Spanish) directly within the video player.
- Fullscreen Mode Allows you to view the video in full-screen for better focus and visibility.











- Overview A short written summary of the lesson content appears beneath the video, providing context and helping you follow the key messages.
- Timestamped Notes These are key moments from the video, marked with time codes and short descriptions. They help you navigate directly to relevant parts of the lesson.
- All Notes A full list of the annotated notes related to the module.
 These are for reference and cannot be downloaded but can be used as a quick revision tool.







You can proceed at your own pace. At the end of each lesson, you may be asked to **mark the module as complete**. The system automatically tracks your progress, so you can leave and return at any time without losing your place.



Each course is designed to **be flexible** and **learner-friendly**.

<u>There is no fixed time frame</u>: you can choose when to start and how quickly to proceed, based on your own availability and learning needs.

To make the most of each course, it is recommended that you:

- Complete all the modules in the proposed order
- Take notes or reflect on the key messages
- Use the e-portfolio tool to record your thoughts and learning outcomes

Following a course attentively will support the development of essential green competences and help you apply new knowledge in real-life and professional contexts.






3.5 How to Complete the Quizzes

All courses on the GYE e-learning platform include **short quizzes** at the end of each module.

These are designed to help you **consolidate your understanding**, **reflect on what you've learned** and **track your progress** throughout the course.

They serve as self-assessment tools, giving you immediate feedback and allowing you to revisit content if needed.








3.5 How to Complete the Quizzes

To complete a quiz:

- 1.Once you have completed a module, scroll to the bottom of the page to locate **the quiz section**, which is clearly marked and accessible from the same module area.
- 2.Click on **the quiz title** to open it. Each quiz contains **a series of multiple-choice questions** designed to check your comprehension of the video lesson and any supplementary material.
- 3. Proceed through **all the questions** by selecting the answer you believe is correct. You must complete **every page of the quiz** to finish the assessment.
- 4. There is **no time limit** for completing quizzes you can go at your own pace and review content if needed before submitting.








3.5 How to Complete the Quizzes

After submitting your responses:

- The system will provide **your score**: answered question, total attempts, earned points and result
- You may be allowed to **retake the quiz** or review the learning material before attempting it again.



Completing the quizzes is **an essential part of the learning process**. They encourage active engagement and allow you to identify any gaps in understanding before moving on to the next module.

Your progress and completion status are saved automatically.

You can monitor your learning progress by either viewing your course dashboard or going back to the course overview.






3.6 How to Use the Forum

The GYE platform includes a **forum section** designed to encourage interaction, dialogue and knowledge sharing among learners.

The forum is **an open space** where participants can **ask questions**, **exchange ideas** and **reflect collectively on the topics** covered in the courses.

This feature supports peer learning and helps create a sense of community, especially within the context of non-formal education and lifelong learning.

If you scroll down, you'll find the section where you can write and publish something






3.6 How to Use the Forum

To access the forum:

- 1.From the main platform menu, click on "MOOC" and then on "Forum".
- 2. You will be redirected to **a list of available discussion threads**. These may be general or linked to specific courses and modules.
- 3.Click on a thread to read the conversation or select "Create new topic" to start a new discussion.

3.6 How to Use the Forum

When writing a post:

- Clearly state your question, idea, or comment in the subject line.
- **Use the text editor** to write your message. You may also include links, quotes or reflections.
- Be respectful and constructive in your language, following the platform's community guidelines.
- Click "Submit" to publish your message.



The forum can be used to:

- Share insights or experiences related to the course content
- Ask questions or clarify doubts with peers and facilitators
- Reflect on your personal learning journey
- Suggest additional resources or activities
- Engage in discussions around sustainability and green skills

Using the forum is not mandatory, but it **is strongly encouraged**.


Active participation can enrich your learning experience, offer new perspectives, and help build connections with other users across Europe.





The e-portfolio is a dedicated space on the GYE platform that allows each learner to document their experience, reflect on their progress and collect useful evidence to support both <u>personal development</u> and <u>professional growth</u>.

You can access your e-portfolio by **clicking** on your profile **under** the "Account" menu.








Personal Use and Reflection

The e-portfolio works as a **personal learning journal**. After each module or activity, users can access the "**Status**" box on their profile page to:

- Write reflections on what they have learned
- Summarise key takeaways or ideas
- Define goals or next steps in their green journey
- Save links, files, or media that are meaningful to their experience



This space can be updated freely throughout the learning experience.

There are **no strict formats**, and learners are free to express their thoughts in their own words. Some courses may also provide **guiding questions** to support deeper reflection.





Career-Oriented Use


Beyond personal use, the e-portfolio can be a **practical career-oriented tool**. It helps you:

- Record and describe competences acquired during the course
- Document completed activities, lessons or contributions
- Build a structured overview of their learning path
- Prepare for job applications, especially in the field of emerging green jobs

This function supports the **recognition of transversal competences** and **non-formal learning outcomes**, both of which are becoming increasingly valuable for employment in sustainability-related sectors.

The "Learning Outcome" Section

The platform includes a dedicated "Learning Outcome" section on the user profile based on the 8-key compenteces and YouthPass.








Here, users are invited to **complete a structured reflection** on the **8 Key Competences for Lifelong Learning** and the **Youthpass** framework. This is done via a Google Form, which generates a downloadable PDF that can be **attached to the e-portfolio** as additional documentation. This section connects personal learning to broader recognition frameworks like Youthpass, helping learners to better communicate their learning journey and its relevance to the professional world.

The Youthpass is a European recognition tool that supports the validation and reflection of non-formal and informal learning. Rooted in the principles of lifelong learning, it empowers young people to understand, articulate, and showcase the skills and knowledge they acquire through projects like GYE. Reflecting on these 8 key competences not only strengthens personal growth but also enhances employability, self-awareness, and active participation in society. By using this framework, learners gain the language and structure to describe their learning journey, helping bridge the gap between youth work, education, and the job market.







4. Need Help? Where to find Support



- A short message describing your request


Once submitted, your message will be forwarded to the project team, who will get back to you as soon as possible.
